UCLA Extension Courses

The letters preceding a course number indicate the University of California campus at which there is an equivalent course, e.g., XL-Los Angeles, XI-Irvine. A "C" immediately following the campus designation indicates a concurrent course (campus regular session course in which Extension students may concurrently enroll), e.g., XLC-Los Angeles campus concurrent course. When the letter "X" alone is used, the course is offered only through Extension and is not equivalent to a regular session course. A single capital letter after a course number indicates a sequential course that continues through two or more successive quarters. Course numbers are classified as:

- 1-99: Lower division - require successful completion of one year of college, or consent of instructor.
- 100-199: Upper division - require successful completion of two years of college, or consent of instructor.
- 200-299: Graduate - require a Bachelor's degree and consent of instructor.

Summary

- 300-399: Professional credit courses in education - require employment as a teacher, teaching credential or equivalent background, unless otherwise noted.
- 400-499: Professional credit courses in fields other than education.
- 700-799: Special enrichment courses for participants of pre-college age.
- 800-899: Noncredit courses. Many offer Continuing Education Units.
